#### Road Safety/Pedestrian Safety Campaign

Pedestrian safety on the surrounding streets remains a concern for many parents. This matter has been raised with council during the rebuild and again since. With the upcoming local government elections and the council's recent <u>Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan (PAMP)</u> report, it's time for round three!

We were fortunate to have had the opportunity this week to meet with Deputy Mayor of Canada Bay Council. Councillor Julia Little met with Dan Sprange, Rebecca Nichols and Wendy Shih as parent and P&C representatives regarding a safe crossing for Barnstaple Road. As the school accesses Nield Park regularly, this location is our first priority. Brent Street pedestrian safety and the McCulloch St footpath near the school were also discussed.

Cr Little has offered her support by tabling this at the next council meeting. Traffic management studies will need to be conducted in the coming months but this is a positive first step and we thank Julia Little for being our advocate.

### **OCTOBER P&C MEETING SUMMARY**


Thank you to those who joined via Zoom on Tuesday 12th October. We have some updates to share:

**Raffle Draw Date Confirmed** - we are pleased to be able to draw our raffle on **Friday 29th October**. **WestConnex Grant** - it was discussed and agreed to pursue the opportunity of a grant for a *yarning circle and bush tucker trees for the nature area* near the corner of McCulloch and Whittal Streets. Keith Stead (Lucy 1/2P) is assisting us with the design. Thank you Keith! We also require quotations from landscapers to carry out the works (in summary, the placement of sandstone blocks and laying a crushed sandstone foundation for the yarning circle). If any parents or family members are in the business, we could use some swift assistance with quotes in order to submit the grant application by 1st November. **Acknowledgement of Country sign and artwork sign -** the project is moving forward with the wording for the Acknowledgement of Country sign approved by the Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council. The sign to acknowledge the ceiling mural artwork by Blak Douglas has been prepared and reviewed by the artist. Both are now with the sign company and we look forward to seeing the proofs and deciding on the final versions to be produced.

**Stage 3 Science Order / Future Funding Requests Process / 2022 Priorities** - the P&C Exec team have prepared funding request guidelines for implementation in 2022. The aim is to have a robust process in place for funding requests that can be submitted by parents, teachers, principal and P&C members. We used a Stage 3 Science Order funding request as an example of how the process will work. Thank you to Ms Lee for providing us with the requested information so the P&C committee could approve the \$1800 spend for the Stage 3 science and mathematics equipment at our October meeting.

Before the end of this term we would like to **survey the parent community** about what they would like the P&C to consider as **projects and initiatives for 2022**. Responses will assist the P&C Exec team with future planning and forecasting as well as understanding what is important to the parent and student community. Look out for the survey coming your way soon.

**Fundraising in 2021** - as with everything in 2021, the Delta variant of COVID-19 has played havoc with our fundraising plans. We have had to cancel the fun run and postpone our Trivia Night/Silent Auction until early next year. We have the upcoming Gingerbread House Kit Drive and may also have the opportunity to hold a cake stall and democracy sausage sizzle at the 4th December local government elections. If all is well with that date and restrictions allow, we will be looking for volunteers to help bake, man the bbq, sell cakes and drinks etc. We look forward to the parent community getting behind our raffle and these final fundraisers for 2021.
